AN ACT DIRECTING THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO ASSIST LOCAL SCHOOL ADMINISTRATIVE UNITS ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND ACT OF 2001.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-12 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: "**§ 115C-12. Powers and duties of the Board generally.**

The general supervision and administration of the free public school system shall be vested in the State Board of Education. The State Board of Education shall establish policy for the system of free public schools, subject to laws enacted by the General Assembly. The powers and duties of the State Board of Education are defined as follows:

14 (30a) <u>Duty to Assist Schools in Meeting Adequate Yearly Progress. – The</u> 15 State Board of Education shall:

- <u>a.</u> <u>Identify which schools are meeting adequate yearly progress with subgroups as specified in the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001;</u>
- b. Study the instructional, administrative, and fiscal practices and policies employed by the schools selected by the State Board of Education that are meeting adequate yearly progress specified in the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001;
- <u>Create assistance models based on the practices and policies used in schools that are meeting adequate yearly progress. The schools of education at the constituent institutions of The University of North Carolina, in collaboration with the

2	Development, shall assist the State Board of Education
3	developing these models; and
4	d. Offer technical assistance based on these assistance models
5	local school administrative units not meeting adequate year
6	progress, giving priority to those local school administrative

9	determine the number of local school administrative units th

16	SECTION 2. The State Board of Education and the Department of Publ
17	nstruction shall report to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee by Jur
18	5, 2004, and December 15, 2005, on the implementation of Section 1 of this act. The
19	eport shall include:
20	(1) The number and locations of schools meeting adequate yearly progre
21	with the subgroups specified in the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001
22	(2) The assistance models developed for each subgroup;
23	(3) Technical assistance provided to a local school administrative unit or
24	school; and
25	(4) The need for additional resources to implement this act on a statewice
26	basis to comply with the requirements of the No Child Left Behind A
27	of 2001.
28	SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
