A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  AN ACT TO CREATE THE CRIMINAL OFFENSE OF ASSAULT IN PRESENCE OF A CHILD.  The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:  SECTION 1. G.S. 14-33(c) is amended by adding a new subdivision to "(c) Unless the conduct is covered under some other provision of law progreater punishment, any person who commits any assault, assault and battery, or is guilty of a Class A1 misdemeanor if, in the course of the assault, assault and lor affray, he or she:		
	(7)	Commits an assault with a deadly weapon or an assault that inflicts serious injury on a person with whom he or she has a personal relationship in the presence of a minor who is residing with or in the custody of the person assaulted. The following definitions shall apply in this subdivision:  a. "In the presence of a minor" means:  1. In the physical presence of the minor; or  2. Having knowledge that a child is present and may see on hear the offense.  b. "Minor" is as defined in G.S. 48A-2.  c. "Personal relationship" is as defined in G.S. 50B-1(b)."
		<b>CCTION 2.</b> This act becomes effective December 1, 2003, and applies to
	offenses com	mitted on or after that date.
