5	EMPLOYMENT SECURITY COMMISSION IS GUILTY OF A FELONY, SO AS
6	TO DETER THE PRACTICE OF STATE EMPLOYMENT TAX AVOIDANCE
7	(SUTA DUMPING).
8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
9	SECTION 1. G.S. 96-18(b) reads as rewritten:
10	"(b) Any employing unit or any officer or agent of an employing unit or any other
11	person who makes a false statement or representation, knowing it to be false, or who
12	knowingly fails to disclose a material fact to prevent or reduce the payment of benefits
13	to any individual entitled thereto, or to avoid becoming or remaining subject hereto or to
14	avoid or reduce any contributions or other payment required from an employing unit
15	under this Chapter, or who willfully fails or refuses to furnish any reports required
16	hereunder, or to produce or permit the inspection or copying of records as required
17	hereunder, shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor; and each such false statement or
18	representation or failure to disclose a material fact, and each day of such failure or
19	refusal shall constitute a separate offense. Notwithstanding G.S. 14-2.6(b), any person
20	who solicits any person to violate this subsection is guilty of a Class H felony. Any
21	person, other than the employing unit or an officer or employee of that unit, who
22	conspires to violate this subsection, is guilty of a Class H felony."
23	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
