1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO CHANGE THE METHOD BY WHICH CERTAIN MEMBERS ON THE
3	NORTH CAROLINA BOARD OF NURSING ARE ELECTED OR APPOINTED,
4	TO MAKE TECHNICAL CHANGES TO THE NURSING PRACTICE ACT, AND
5	TO REQUIRE THAT HEALTH CARE FACILITIES VERIFY THE LICENSURE
6	STATUS OF APPLICANTS SEEKING EMPLOYMENT AS NURSES.
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
8	SECTION 1. G.S. 90-171.21 reads as rewritten:
9	"§ 90-171.21. Board of Nursing; composition; selection; vacancies; qualifications;
10	term of office; compensation.
11	(a) The Board shall consist of <u>15_14</u> members. <u>Nine_Eight</u> members shall be
12	registered nurses. Four-Three members shall be licensed practical nurses. Two-Three
13	members shall be representatives of the public.
14	(b) Selection. – The North Carolina Board of Nursing shall conduct an election
15	each year to fill vacancies of nurse members of the Board scheduled to occur during the
16	next year. Nominations of candidates for election of registered nurse members shall be
17	made by written petition signed by not less than 10 registered nurses eligible to vote in
18	the election. Nominations of candidates for election of licensed practical nurse members
19	shall be made by written petition signed by not less than 10 licensed practical nurses
20	eligible to vote in the election. Every licensed registered nurse holding an active license
21	shall be eligible to vote in the election of registered nurse board members. Every
22	licensed practical nurse holding an active license shall be eligible to vote in the election
23	of licensed practical nurse board members. The list of nominations shall be filed with
24	the Board after January 1 of the year in which the election is to be held and no later than
25	midnight of the first day of April of such year. Before preparing ballots, the Board shall
26	notify each person who has been duly nominated of his the person's nomination and
27	request permission to enter his the person's name on the ballot. A member of the Board

who is nominated to succeed himself for reelection and who does not withdraw his the 1 2 member's name from the ballot is disqualified to participate in conducting the election. 3 Elected members shall begin their term of office on January 1 of the year following 4 their election. 5 Nominations of persons to serve as public members of the Board may be made to the 6 Governor or the General Assembly by any citizen or group within the State. The 7 Governor shall appoint the two public members one public member to the Board. Board, 8 and the General Assembly shall appoint two public members to the Board. Of the public 9 members appointed by the General Assembly, one shall be appointed by the General 10 Assembly upon the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and one shall be appointed by the General Assembly upon the recommendation of the 11 12 Speaker of the House of Representatives. Board members shall be commissioned by the Governor upon their election or 13 14 appointment. 15 (c) Vacancies. - All unexpired terms of Board members appointed by the General Assembly shall be filled within 45 days after the term is vacated. The Governor 16 17 shall fill all other unexpired terms on the Board within 30 days after the term is vacated. 18 For vacancies of registered nurse or licensed practical nurse members, the Governor shall appoint the person who received the next highest number of votes to those elected 19 20 members at the most recent election for board members. The Governor shall select the 21 public member to fill any vacancy of a public member. Appointees shall serve the remainder of the unexpired term and until their successors have been duly elected or 22 23 appointed and qualified. 24 Qualifications. - Three of the registered nurse members shall hold positions (d) with primary responsibility in nursing education and shall hold baccalaureate or 25 advanced degrees. Six shall hold positions with primary responsibility in providing 26 27 nursing care to patients. Of the six registered nurse members with primary responsibility in providing nursing care to patients, two shall be employed by a hospital and at least 28 29 one shall be a hospital nursing service director; one shall be employed by a physician 30 licensed to practice medicine in North Carolina and engaged in the private practice of medicine; one shall be employed by a skilled or intermediate care facility; one shall be 31 32 either a nurse practitioner, nurse anesthetist, nurse midwife, or clinical nurse specialist; 33 and one shall be a community health nurse. If no nurse is nominated in one of the categories, the position shall be an at-large registered nursing position. Of the eight 34 35 registered nurse members on the Board, one shall be a nurse administrator employed by a hospital or a hospital system, who shall be accountable for the administration of 36 nursing services and not directly involved in patient care; one shall be an individual who 37 38 meets the requirements to practice as a certified registered nurse anesthetist, a certified nurse midwife, a clinical nurse specialist, or a nurse practitioner; two shall be staff 39 nurses, defined as individuals who are primarily involved in direct patient care 40 regardless of practice setting; one shall be an at-large registered nurse who meets the 41 requirements of sub-subdivisions (1)a. and b. of this subsection, but is not currently an 42 educator in a program leading to licensure or any other degree-granting program; and 43 three shall be nurse educators. Of the three nurse educators, one shall be a practical 44

35	"(a)	A nui	rsing pro	ogram may be operated under the authority of a general hospital,			
36	or an approved post-secondary educational institution. The Board shall establish, revise,						
37	or repeal standards for nursing programs. These standards shall specify program						
38	requirements, curricula, faculty, students, facilities, resources, administration, and						
39	describe the approval process. Any institution desiring to establish a nursing program						
40	shall apply to the Board and submit satisfactory evidence that it will meet the standards						
41	prescribed established by the Board. Those standards shall be designed to ensure that						
42	graduates of those programs have the education necessary to safely and competently						
43	practice nursing. The Board shall encourage the continued operation of all present						
44	programs that meet the standards approved by the Board."						

1	SECTION 5. G.S. 90-171.40 reads as rewritten:					
2	"§ 90-171.40. Periodic surveys. <u>Ongoing approval.</u>					
3	The Board shall designate persons to survey review all nursing programs in the State					
4	at least every five eight years or more often as deemed considered necessary. Written					
5	reports of such surveys shall be submitted to the Board. If the Board determines that any					
6	approved nursing program does not meet or maintain the standards required by the					
7	Board, the Board shall give written notice thereof in writing specifying the deficiencies					
8	shall be given immediately to the institution responsible for the program. The Board					
9	shall withdraw approval from a program which that fails to correct deficiencies within a					
10	reasonable time. The Board shall publish annually a list of nursing programs in this					
11	State showing their approval status."					
12	SECTION 6. Article 9A of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended					
13	by adding a new section to read:					
14	"§ 90-171.43A. Mandatory employer verification of licensure status.					
15	(a) Before hiring a registered nurse or a licensed practical nurse in North					
16 17	Carolina, a health care facility shall verify that the applicant has a current, valid license					
17 18	to practice nursing pursuant to G.S. 90-171.43.					
18 19	(b) For purposes of this section, 'health care facility' means: (1) Facilities described in G.S. 131E-256(b).					
19 20	 (1) Facilities described in G.S. 131E-256(b). (2) Public health departments, physicians' offices, ambulatory care 					
20 21	<u>facilities, and rural health clinics.</u> "					
21	SECTION 7. The terms of members serving on the Board of Nursing on					
22	December 31, 2004, expire on that date. To establish staggered terms for the					
23 24	appointments of public members made pursuant to G.S. 90-171.21(b), as enacted in					
25	Section 1 of this act, the Governor shall appoint one member for a four-year term, the					
26	General Assembly, upon the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the					
27	Senate, shall appoint one member for a three-year term, and the General Assembly,					
28	upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives, shall appoint					
29	one member for a two-year term.					
30	To stagger terms for members elected to the Board, the Board shall conduct					
31	an election in 2004 pursuant to G.S. 90-171.21(b) to elect members as follows:					
32	(1) An at-large registered nurse and a licensed practical nurse, to serve for					
33	a one-year term.					
34	(2) A staff registered nurse, a registered nurse who is an associate degree					
35	or diploma nurse educator, and a licensed practical nurse, each to serve					
36	for a two-year term.					
37	(3) A registered nurse who is a baccalaureate or higher degree nurse					
38	educator, a registered nurse administrator employed by a hospital or a					
39	hospital system, and a licensed practical nurse, each to serve for a					
40	three-year term.					
41	(4) A staff registered nurse, a registered nurse who is a practical nurse					
42	educator, and either a certified registered nurse anesthetist, a certified					
43	nurse midwife, a clinical nurse specialist, or a nurse practitioner, each					
44	to serve for a four-year term.					

- All members appointed and elected to the Board pursuant to this section shall begin serving their terms on January 1, 2005. After staggered terms have been established, all subsequent appointments and elections to the Board shall be for four-year terms. For the purpose of initial application of the provisions of G.S. 90-171.21(e) that limit members to eight consecutive years of service, consecutive service as of December 31, 2004, shall count, and if the member reaches the eight-year maximum during a term of office, that person is not eligible to continue in office and a vacancy is created to be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term
