15		to the State definition to include 'acquired brain injury' or other

9	(b) The terms of the initial members of the Council shall commence October 1,
10	2003. In his initial appointments, the Governor shall designate four members who shall
11	serve terms of four years, four members who shall serve terms of three years, and three
12	members who shall serve terms of two years. After the initial appointees' terms have
13	expired, all members shall be appointed for a term of four years. No member appointed
14	by the Governor shall serve more than two successive terms.
15	Any appointment to fill a vacancy on the Council created by the resignation,
16	dismissal, death, or disability of a member shall be for the balance of the unexpired
17	term.
18	(c) The chair of the Council shall be designated by the Secretary of the
19	Department of Health and Human Services from the Council members. The chair shall
20	hold this office for not more than four years.
21	(d) The Council shall meet quarterly and at other times at the call of the chair. A
22	majority of the Council shall constitute a quorum.
23	(e) Council members shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred in the
24	performance of their duties in accordance with G.S. 138-5 and G.S. 138-6, as
25	applicable.
26	(f) The Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services shall provide
27	clerical and other assistance as needed."

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
