1 A HOUSE RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE PERMANENT RULES OF THE 2004  
2 EXTRA SESSION OF THE NORTH CAROLINA HOUSE OF  
3 REPRESENTATIVES.

4 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives:

5 **SECTION 1.** The permanent rules of the 2003 Regular Session of the House  
6 of Representatives, with the following amendments, are adopted as the permanent rules  
7 of the 2004 Extra Session:

8 (1) RULE 1 shall read as follows: "RULE 1. **Convening Hour.** The  
9 House shall convene each legislative day at the hour fixed by the  
10 House. In the event the House adjourns on the preceding legislative  
11 day without having fixed an hour for reconvening, the House shall  
12 convene on the next legislative day at 10:00 A.M."

13 (2) Notwithstanding RULE 26, the Committee on Rules, Calendar, and  
14 Operations of the House, the Ethics Committee, the Finance  
15 Committee, and the Appropriations Committee shall be comprised of  
16 the members who were appointed during the Regular Session and  
17 other members as the Speaker may appoint at the beginning of the  
18 Extra Session. The Chairs and Vice-Chairs of those committees shall  
19 be those who were appointed by the Speaker during the Regular  
20 Session.

21 (3) Notwithstanding RULE 27, the standing committees and permanent  
22 subcommittees of the House are:

24	a. Rules, Calendar, and	
25	Operations of the House	(none)
26	b. Ethics	(none)
27	c. Appropriations	(none)

1 All rules of the 2003 Regular Session applicable to standing  
2 committees and permanent subcommittees of the House other than the  
3 committees named in this subdivision are inoperative. The Speaker  
4 may appoint select committees under RULE 26.

5 (4) Notwithstanding RULE 31(a), any bill or resolution shall be  
6 introduced by submitting the bill or resolution to the Principal Clerk's  
7 Office.

8 (5) Notwithstanding RULES 31 and 31.1:

9 a. The only resolutions that may be introduced or considered in  
10 the House are resolutions adjourning the 2004 Extra Session  
11 sine die.

12 b. All bills shall be excluded from introduction or consideration in  
13 the House, other than bills concerning matters described in the  
14 Governor's Proclamation of an Extra Session dated October 27,  
15 2004.

16 (6) RULE 31.1 shall not apply to resolutions adjourning the 2004 Extra  
17 Session sine die and bills concerning matters described in the  
18 Governor's Proclamation of an Extra Session dated October 27, 2004.

19 (7) Notwithstanding RULES 32, 38, and 41, a resolution or bill may be  
20 placed on the calendar without being referred by the Speaker to a  
21 committee and on the same legislative day of its introduction or receipt  
22 from the Senate.

23 (8) Notwithstanding RULE 36(a), all House bills and resolutions may be  
24 reported from the standing committee or permanent subcommittee to  
25 which referred with recommendations as the standing committee or  
26 permanent subcommittee may desire to make.

27 (9) Notwithstanding RULE 41:

28 a. The first reading and reference to a standing committee of a  
29 House bill shall occur on the legislative day of its introduction.  
30 The first reading and reference to a standing committee of a  
31 Senate bill shall occur on the legislative day of its receipt on  
32 messages from the Senate. The Speaker shall give notice at each  
33 subsequent reading whether it is the second or third reading.

34 b. Except for a bill governed by Article II, Section 23 of the North  
35 Carolina Constitution, a bill may be read more than once on the  
36 same day.

37 (10) Notwithstanding RULE 44(d), a conference report may be placed on  
38 the calendar for the legislative day on which the report is received.

39 (11) Notwithstanding RULE 59, any member wishing to cosponsor a bill or  
40 resolution that has been introduced may do so by appearing in the  
41 office of the Principal Clerk for that purpose on the day during which  
42 the bill or resolution was first read and referred, but only while the bill  
43 or resolution is in the possession of the House.

44 **SECTION 2.** This resolution is effective upon adoption.
