A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO MODIFY ENVIRONMENTAL REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. 3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 4 SECTION 1. G.S. 143-215.8C is repealed. SECTION 2. G.S. 143-215.107C reads as rewritten: 5 "§ 143-215.107C. State agency goals, plans, duties, and reports. 6 7 . . . 8 (d) The Department of Administration, the Office of State Personnel, the 9 Department of Transportation, and the Department of Environment and Natural Resources shall jointly develop and periodically update a plan to reduce vehicle miles 10 traveled by State employees and vehicle emissions resulting from job-related travel, 11 including commuting to and from work. The plan shall consider the use of carpooling, 12 vanpooling, public transportation, incentives, and other appropriate strategies. The 13 Office of State PersonnelDepartment of Transportation shall report on the development 14 and implementation of the plan to the Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight 15 Committee and the Environmental Review Commission on or before 1 October of each 16 year beginning 1 October 2000. 17 18 (e) The Department of Transportation, the Department of Commerce, and the Department of Environment and Natural Resources shall jointly develop and 19 periodically update a plan to reduce vehicle miles traveled by private sector employees 20 21 and vehicle emissions resulting from job-related travel, including commuting to and 22 from work. The plan shall consider the use of incentives for both private sector employees and employers, carpooling, vanpooling, public transportation, and other 23 appropriate strategies. The Department of Transportation shall report on the 24 25 development and implementation of the plan to the Joint Legislative Transportation

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Oversight Committee and the Environmental Review Commission on or before 1
October of each year beginning 1 October 2000.

3 The Office of State Personnel shall implement a policy that promotes (f) 4 telework/telecommuting for State employees as recommended by the report of the State 5 Auditor entitled "Establishing a Formal Telework/Telecommuting Program for State 6 Employees" and dated October 1997. It shall be the goal of the State to reduce State 7 employee vehicle miles traveled in commuting by twenty percent (20%) without 8 reducing total work hours or productivity. The Office of State Personnel shall report on 9 progress in implementing this section to the Environmental Review Commission on or 10 before 1 October of each year beginning 1 October 2000."

11 **SECTION 3.** The primary investigator or researcher for the Neuse River 12 Modeling and Monitoring Project shall provide a final report summarizing the findings 13 and outcomes of the Project to the Environmental Review Commission no later than 1 14 November 2005.

SECTION 4. Section 1 of this act becomes effective 1 December 2005.
Sections 2 through 4 of this act become effective when it becomes law.
