1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO REVISE THE PROCEDURE BY WHICH THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ELECTS THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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SECTION 1. G.S. 116-6 reads as rewritten:

"§ 116-6. Election and terms of members of Board of Governors.

- (a) As the terms of members of the Board of Governors provided for in G.S. 116-5 expire, their successors shall be elected by the Senate and House of Representatives. Sixteen members shall be elected at the regular legislative session in 1993-2007 and every two years thereafter. The Senate and the House of Representatives shall each elect one-half of the persons necessary to fill the vacancies on the Board of Governors. Of the 16 members elected every two years beginning in 2007, each one shall represent a different constituent institution.

- (b1) In 2007, and every four years thereafter, the Senate shall elect a member nominated by the Board of Trustees of each of the following constituent institutions: the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, the University of North Carolina at Asheville, the University of North Carolina at Wilmington, Elizabeth City State University, Fayetteville State University, North Carolina Central University, and the North Carolina School of the Arts. In 2007, and every four years thereafter, the House of Representatives shall elect a member nominated by the Board of Trustees of each of the following constituent institutions: North Carolina State University, the University of North Carolina at Charlotte,
- North Carolina State University, the University of North Carolina at Charlotte,
 Appalachian State University, East Carolina University, North Carolina Agricultural
- 26 <u>and Technical State University, the University of North Carolina at Pembroke, Western</u>
- 27 <u>Carolina University, and Winston-Salem State University.</u>
- In 2009, and every four years thereafter, the Senate shall elect a member nominated by the Board of Trustees of each of the following constituent institutions: North

- Carolina State University, the University of North Carolina at Charlotte, Appalachian 1
- State University, East Carolina University, North Carolina Agricultural and Technical 2
- 3 State University, the University of North Carolina at Pembroke, Western Carolina
- University, and Winston-Salem State University. In 2009, and every four years 4
- 5 thereafter, the House of Representatives shall elect a member nominated by the Board
- 6 of Trustees of each of the following constituent institutions: the University of North
- Carolina at Chapel Hill, the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, the University 7
- 8 of North Carolina at Asheville, the University of North Carolina at Wilmington,
- 9 Elizabeth City State University, Fayetteville State University, North Carolina Central 10
 - University, and the North Carolina School of the Arts.
 - The Board of Trustees of each constituent institution shall submit a list of four candidates to the General Assembly by February 1, 2007, and by February 1 every two years thereafter. In electing members to the Board of Governors, the Senate and the House of Representatives shall select from thea slate of candidates made in each house.submitted by the Board of Trustees of the constituent institutions. The slate shall be prepared as provided by resolution of each house. If a sufficient number of nominees who are legally qualified are submitted, then the slate of candidates shall list at least twice the number of candidates for the total seats open. All qualified candidates shall compete against all other qualified candidates. In 1993 and biennially thereafter, each house shall hold their elections within 30 legislative days after appointments to their education committees are complete.
 - All terms shall commence on July 1 of odd-numbered years and all members shall serve for four-year overlapping terms.
 - No person may be elected to: (e)
 - (1) More than three full four-year terms in succession;
 - A four-year term if preceded immediately by election to two full (2) eight-year terms in succession; or
 - A four-year term if preceded immediately by election to an eight-year (3) term and a four-year term in succession.

Resignation from a term of office does not constitute a break in service for the purpose of this subsection. Service prior to the beginning of those terms in 1989 shall be included in the limitations.

- Any person who has served at least one full term as chairman of the Board of Governors shall be a member emeritus of the Board of Governors for one four-year term beginning at the expiration of that member's regular elected term. Any person already serving as an emeritus member may serve an additional four-year term beginning July 1, 1991. Members emeriti have all the rights and privileges of membership except they do not have a vote.
- Effective July 1, 1991, and thereafter, any person who has served at least one term as a member of the Board of Governors after having served as Governor of North Carolina shall be a member emeritus of the Board of Governors, with all the rights and privileges of membership as in G.S. 116-6(f)."

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.

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
