**SECTION 3.** The Legislative Services Commission shall assign professional

and clerical staff to assist the Commission in its work. The Commission may meet at

various locations around the State. The Legislative Services Commission shall grant				
adequate meeting space to the Commission in the State Legislative Building or				
Legislative Office Building. The Commission may meet during regular or extra sessions				
of the General Assembly, subject to approval of the Speaker of the House of				
Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.				

**SECTION 4.** The Commission may contract for consultant services as provided by G.S. 120-32.02.

**SECTION 5.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General Assembly the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to establish the Joint Legislative Commission on Students and Civics.

**SECTION 6.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2006.
