A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO REPEAL A DUPLICATIVE SCHOOL ACCREDITATION REQUIREMENT.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** G.S. 115C-12(9)c. reads as rewritten:

## "§ 115C-12. Powers and duties of the Board generally.

The general supervision and administration of the free public school system shall be vested in the State Board of Education. The State Board of Education shall establish policy for the system of free public schools, subject to laws enacted by the General Assembly. The powers and duties of the State Board of Education are defined as follows:

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(9) Miscellaneous Powers and Duties. – All the powers and duties exercised by the State Board of Education shall be in conformity with the Constitution and subject to such laws as may be enacted from time to time by the General Assembly. Among such duties are:

...

c. To adopt rules requiring all local boards of education to implement the Basic Education Program on an incremental basis within funds appropriated for that purpose by the General Assembly and by units of local government. Beginning with the 1991-92 school year, the rules shall require each local school administrative unit to implement fully the standard course of study in every school in the State in accordance with the Basic Education Program so that every student in the State shall have equal access to the curriculum as provided in the Basic Education Program and the standard course of study.

The Board shall establish benchmarks by which to measure 1 2 the progress that each local board of education has made in 3 implementing the Basic Education Program. The Board shall develop a State accreditation program that 4 5 meets or exceeds the standards and requirements of the Basic 6 Education Program. The Board shall require each local school 7 administrative unit to comply with the State accreditation program to the extent that funds have been made available to 8 9 the local school administrative unit for implementation of the 10 Basic Education Program. The Board shall use the State accreditation program to 11 12 monitor the implementation of the Basic Education Program." **SECTION 2.** G.S. 115C-81(a3) reads as rewritten: 13 14 "§ 115C-81. Basic Education Program. 15 16 (a3) Alcohol and Drug Education Program to Be Recommended and 17 Implemented: 18 (1) A comprehensive education program that includes alcohol and drug use prevention education must be available to every child in North 19 Carolina schools in kindergarten through high school. 20 21 (2) The State Board of Education shall develop and maintain a 22 recommended list of alcohol and drug use prevention education materials that include components for teacher training and ongoing 23 assessment and evaluation to verify success and ensure the use of 24 25 up-to-date information and strategies. The Department of Public Instruction will work to strengthen 26 (3) 27 instructional offerings in the content and skill areas of the Basic 28 Education Program in which alcohol and drug use prevention education is addressed. Curricular materials and resources will be 29 developed that meet, extend, and supplement drug and alcohol 30 education as outlined in the North Carolina Standard Course of Study 31 and the Teacher Handbook for the competency-based curriculum. 32 The Department of Public Instruction shall recommend to the State 33 **(4)** Board of Education any drug use prevention education support 34 35 materials that should be removed or added to the recommended list of curricular resources developed and maintained by the State Board of 36 37 Education. 38 (5) Local boards of education may select supplemental alcohol and drug use prevention education materials from the list maintained by the 39 State Board of Education, or develop their own supplemental materials 40 to be approved by the State Board of Education. 41 42 Local boards of education shall implement alcohol and drug use (6) prevention education as a primary part of their comprehensive health 43

education program.

k. Includes information on intervention and treatment services;

Is continually open to revision, expansion and improvement." 1.

**SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law.

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
