For support of the General Court of Justice, the sum of sixty-nine (2) 1 dollars (\$69.00) in the superior court, except that if a case is 2 3 assigned to a special superior court judge as a complex business case under G.S. 7A-45.3, an additional two hundred dollars (\$200.00) shall 4 5 be paid upon its assignment, and the sum of fifty-four dollars (\$54.00) 6 in the district court except that if the case is assigned to a magistrate 7 the sum shall be forty-three dollars (\$43.00). PART II. DISTRICT COURT JUDGE TERM.

SECTION 3. G.S. 7A-140 reads as rewritten:

"§ 7A-140. Number; election; term; qualification; oath.

There shall be at least one district judge for each district. Each district judge shall be elected by the qualified voters of the district court district in which he <u>or she</u> is to serve at the time of the election for members of the General Assembly. The number of judges for each district shall be determined by the General Assembly. Each judge shall be a resident of the district for which elected, and shall serve a term of four years, beginning on the first Monday in Decemberday in January next following hisafter election.

Each district judge shall devote his <u>or her</u> full time to the duties of <u>histhe</u> office. He <u>or she</u> shall not practice law during <u>histhe</u> term, nor shall he <u>or she</u> during such term be the partner or associate of any person engaged in the practice of law.

Before entering upon his <u>or her</u> duties, each district judge, in addition to other oaths prescribed by law, shall take the oath of office prescribed for a judge of the General Court of Justice."

PART III. EFFECTIVE DATES.

SECTION 5. Sections 1 and 2 of this act become effective January 1, 2006, and apply to fees assessed or collected on or after that date. Sections 3 and 4 of this act are effective when they become law. Judges elected in 2006 and thereafter take office accordingly, and as provided by Section 10 of Article VI of the North Carolina Constitution and G.S. 128-7, those in office on the first Monday in December of 2006 or 2008 shall continue until their successors' terms begin and are duly qualified.
