1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO ELIMINATE THE PROHIBITION AGAINST CERTAIN SPOUSES OF 3 MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF 4 NORTH CAROLINA, MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF A 5 CONSTITUENT INSTITUTION, OR MEMBERS OF THE STATE BOARD OF 6 COMMUNITY COLLEGES FROM BEING EMPLOYEES OR OFFICERS OF 7 THE STATE AND TO PROHIBIT MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY 8 FROM SERVING ON THE BOARDS OF TRUSTEES OF COMMUNITY 9 COLLEGES. 10 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** G.S. 116-7(b) reads as rewritten: 11 12 From and after July 1, 1973, noNo member of the General Assembly or "(b) officer or employee of the State or ofState, The University of North Carolina, or any 13 constituent institution or spouse of any such member, officer or employee may be a 14 15 member of the Board of Governors. No spouse of a member of the General Assembly, or of an officer or employee of The University of North Carolina, or any constituent 16 institution may be a member of the Board of Governors. Any member of the Board of 17 Governors who is elected or appointed to the General Assembly or who becomes an 18 19 officer or employee of the State or of any constituent institution or whose spouse is 20 elected or appointed to the General Assembly or becomes such an officer or employee 21 of The University of North Carolina, or any constituent institution shall be deemed 22 thereupon to resign from his membership on the Board of Governors." 23 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 116-31(h) reads as rewritten: 24 From and after July 1, 1973, noNo member of the General Assembly or "(h) 25 officer or employee of the State or ofState, The University of North Carolina, or any 26 constituent institution or spouse of any such member, officer or employee shall be

eligible for election or appointment as a trustee. No spouse of a member of the General

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Assembly, or of an officer or employee of a constituent institution may be a trustee of 1 2 that constituent institution. Any trustee who is elected or appointed to the General 3 Assembly or who becomes an officer or employee of the State or ofState, The 4 University of North Carolina, or any constituent institution or whose spouse is elected 5 or appointed to the General Assembly or becomes such an officer or employee of that 6 constituent institution shall be deemed thereupon to resign from his membership on the 7 board of trustees." 8 **SECTION 3.** G.S. 115D-2.1(d) reads as rewritten: 9 "(d) No member of the General Assembly, no officer or employee of the State, 10 and no officer or employee of an institution under the jurisdiction of the State Board and 11 no spouse of any of those persons, shall be eligible to serve on the State Board. No 12 spouse of a member of the General Assembly or of an officer or employee of the 13 Community College System or of an institution under the jurisdiction of the State Board 14 shall be eligible to serve on the State Board. Furthermore, noNo person who within the 15 prior five years has been an employee of the Community Colleges System Office shall be eligible to serve on the State Board." 16 17 **SECTION 4.** G.S. 115D-12(b1) reads as rewritten: 18 "(b1) No person who has been employed full time by the community college within 19 the prior 5 years and no spouse or child of a person currently employed full time by the 20 community college shall serve on the board of trustees of that college.college. 21 Notwithstanding G.S. 115D-16 and G.S. 128-1.1, no member of the General Assembly 22 shall be eligible to serve on the board of trustees of a community college." 23 SECTION 5. Section 4 of this act is effective when it becomes law and
