10	funding pursuant to the Program, the results of the evaluation conducted pursuant to
11	subdivision (5) of subsection (b) of this section, findings regarding the effectiveness of
12	each project to accomplish its primary purpose, and any recommendations to assure that
13	State funding is used in the most cost-effective manner and accomplishes the greatest
14	improvement in water quality."
15	SECTION 2. The Community Conservation Assistance Program Advisory
16	Committee shall review the Program prior to expenditure of any funds from the
17	Program. The Advisory Committee shall report on the findings of its Program review to
18	the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate,
19	the Chairs of the Appropriations Committees of the Senate and the House of
20	Representatives, the Director of the Fiscal Research Division of the Legislative Services
21	Office, and the Environmental Review Commission no later than 31 March 2007.
22	SECTION 3. The first report required pursuant to G.S. 143-215.74M(e), as
23	enacted by Section 1 of this act, is due on or before 31 January 2008.
24	SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
