## GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF NORTH CAROLINA SESSION 2005

**SENATE BILL 583** 

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Short Title: NCNG Heroes Act of 2005. (Public) Sponsors: Senators Forrester; Allran, Berger of Rockingham, Blake, Brock, Brown, Garwood, Hartsell, Horton, Jacumin, Pittenger, Presnell, Smith, Thomas, and Tillman. Referred to: Appropriations/Base Budget. March 16, 2005 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT CREATING A FUND TO PROVIDE A DEATH BENEFIT FOR MEMBERS OF THE NORTH CAROLINA NATIONAL GUARD KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY AND TO PROVIDE A FREE HIGHER EDUCATION FOR QUALIFIED DEPENDENTS OF THOSE MEMBERS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** Chapter 127A of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new Article to read: "Article 17. "North Carolina National Guard Death Benefit and Dependent Higher Education Fund. "§ 127A-210. Short title. This Article shall be known and may be cited as the North Carolina National Guard Death Benefit and Dependent Higher Education Fund. "§ 127A-211. Purpose. The General Assembly of North Carolina finds that: The North Carolina National Guard has a proud tradition of military (1) service with thousands of North Carolinians having answered the call of the nation and served in the North Carolina National Guard. Members of the North Carolina National Guard are now being asked to (2) serve extended periods of active duty in combat areas. **(3)** Members of the North Carolina National Guard provide North Carolina and its citizens valuable benefits through their service inside this State and through their recently extended periods of active duty in combat areas outside North Carolina. There have been instances in which dependents of members of the <u>(4)</u>

North Carolina National Guard have been left without adequate

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**SECTION 3.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Crime Control and Public Safety the sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) for the 2005-2006 fiscal year to establish the North Carolina National Guard Group Death Benefit and Dependent Higher Education Fund.

**SECTION 4.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2005.

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
