1	(11) Facilities guidelines that reflect educational program appropriateness,
2	long-term cost efficiency, and safety considerations; and
3	(12) Any other information the Board considers appropriate and necessary.
4	The State Board shall not adopt or enforce any rule that requires Algebra I as a
5	graduation standard or as a requirement for a high school diploma for any student whose
6	individualized education program (i) identifies the student as learning disabled in the
7	area of mathematics and (ii) states that this learning disability will prevent the student
8	from mastering Algebra I.
9	The State Board shall not adopt or enforce any rule that does not give credit toward
10	graduation to all middle school students who successfully complete courses that are
11	required for high school graduation."
