1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR AN ASSESSMENT OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE
3	NEEDS OF THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS, THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE SYSTEM,
4	AND THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1.(a) Establishment of the Commission. – There is established in
7	the Office of the State Auditor the Commission to Assess the Overhead and
8	Administrative Personnel Requirements of the Public Schools, the Community College
9	System, and The University of North Carolina.
10	SECTION 1.(b) Membership. – The Commission shall consist of eight
11	members who are accountants or management consultants. Four of the members shall
12	be appointed by the State Auditor, two shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore
13	of the Senate, and two shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
14	Representatives.
15	The State Auditor shall appoint the chair of the Commission.
16	Vacancies on the Commission shall be filled by the same appointing authority
17	as made the initial appointment.
18	SECTION 1.(c) Duties. – The Commission shall contract with an outside
19	consultant to assess the overhead and administrative personnel requirements of the
20	public schools, the Community College System, and The University of North Carolina.
21	In the course of the assessment, the public schools, the Community College System, and
22	The University of North Carolina shall each be reviewed for efficiencies, the need to
23	eliminate duplication, and any excessive personnel requirements.
24	The review and assessment shall be conducted by accountants, management
25	consultants, and other analysts.
26	SECTION 1.(d) Per Diem. – Members of the Commission shall receive per
27	diem, subsistence, and travel allowances in accordance with G.S. 120-3.1, 138-5, or
28	138-6, as appropriate.

1	SECTION 1.(e) Final Report. – The Commission shall submit a final report
2	of its findings and recommendations, including any legislative recommendations, to the
3	2006 Regular Session of the 2005 General Assembly and to the Office of State Budget
4	and Management.
5	SECTION 1.(f) Termination of the Commission. – The Commission shall
6	terminate upon the submission of its final report.
7	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2005.
