8	(1)	"Audiologist" means any person who engages in the practice of	
9		audiology. A person is deemed to be an audiologist if he offers	
10		services to the public under any title incorporating the terms of	
11		"audiology," "audiologist," "audiological," "hearing clinic," "hearing	
12		clinician," "hearing therapist," or any similar title or description of	
13		service.	
14	(2)	"Board" means the Board of Examiners for Speech and Language	
15		Pathologists and Audiologists.	
16	(3)	"License" means a license issued by the Board under the provisions of	
17		this Article, including a temporary license.	
18	(4)	"Person" means an individual, organization, or corporate body, except	
19		that only individuals can be licensed under this Article.	
20	(5)	"Speech and language pathologist" means any person who represents	
21		himself or herself to the public by title or by description of services,

10			groups of individuals. For the purpose of this subdivision, the words
11			"habilitation" and "rehabilitation" shall include auditory training,
12			speech reading, aural rehabilitation, hearing aid use evaluation and
13			recommendations, and fabrication of earmolds and similar accessories
14			for clinical testing purposes only.

11	require continuing professional education and to amend or repeal the			
12	same."			
13	SECTION 7. Section 4 of this act becomes effective October 1, 2007. The			
14	remaining sections are effective when the act becomes law.
