9	<u>(a)</u>	Any t	time a rental car company quotes a price, the rental car company shall
10	clearly an	nd cons	spicuously disclose or cause to be disclosed the following:
11		<u>(1)</u>	Itemized charges Except as set forth in G.S. 66-203(a) and
12			G.S. 66-204(a), its rental rate, taxes, fees, and any other applicable
13			charges that a renter must pay to hire or lease a vehicle for the period
14			of time to which the rental rate applies.
15		<u>(2)</u>	Mileage conditions. – The terms of any mileage conditions relating to
16			the advertised or quoted rental rate, including, but not limited to: To
17			the extent applicable, the amount of mileage and fuel charges; the
18			number of miles for which no charge will be imposed; and a
19			description of the geographic driving limitations, if any, within the
20			United States and Canada.
21		<u>(3)</u>	Collision damage waivers The daily rate it charges for collision
22			damage waivers shall state that collision damage waivers are not
23			required and shall state that prospective renters should examine or
24			inquire about their automobile insurance policies to see whether such
25			policies will cover damage to rental vehicles.
26	<u>(b)</u>		ny quoted rental rate involving more than one location, a rental car
27			clearly and conspicuously disclose the existence and range of itemized
28	charges listed in section (a) of this section, or the maximum itemized charges.

1	(c) If quoting a price over a voice system or in person, a rental car company shall			
2	inform the renter of the amount of the itemized charges listed in section (a) of this			
3	section or the total amount owed including the itemized charges listed in section (a) of			
4	this section before taking a reservation."			
5	<b>SECTION 3.</b> G.S. 66-203(a) reads as rewritten:			
6	"(a) No rental car company may charge, in addition to the rental rate, taxes,			
7	airport charges and fees, if any, and mileage charge, if any,listed itemized charges			
8	required by G.S. 66-202(a)(1), any fee of the following fees that must be paid by the			
9	renter as a condition of hiring or leasing a vehicle, such as, but not limited to, required			
10	fuel charges or any fee for transporting the renter to the location where the rented			
11	vehicle will be delivered to that person.vehicle:			
12	(1) <u>Required fuel charges.</u>			
13	(2) Any fee for transporting the renter to the location where the rented			
14	vehicle will be delivered to that person."			
15	<b>SECTION 4.</b> G.S. 66-204(a) reads as rewritten:			
16	"(a) In addition to the rental rate, taxes, airport charges and fees, if any, and			
17	mileage charge, if any, listed itemized charges required by G.S. 66-202(a)(1), a rental			
18	car company may charge a renter for an item or service provided in connection with a			
19	particular rental transaction if the renter can avoid incurring that charge by choosing not			
20	to obtain or utilize the optional item or service. Items and services for which a rental car			
21	company may impose an additional charge include, but are not limited to: Optional			
22	insurance and accessories requested by the renter unless otherwise prohibited by law;			
23	service charges incident to a person's optional return of the vehicle to a location other			
24	than the location where the vehicle was hired or leased; and charges for refueling the			
25	vehicle at the conclusion of the rental transaction in the event the rented vehicle is not			
26	returned with as much fuel as was in its fuel tank at the beginning of the rental."			
27	<b>SECTION 5.</b> This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
