1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE WILDLIFE RESOURCES COMMISSION TO
3	ISSUE PROCLAMATIONS UNDER SPECIFIC CIRCUMSTANCES
4	NECESSARY TO PROTECT WILDLIFE RESOURCES FROM SERIOUS AND
5	UNFORESEEN OVER-HARVEST OR DISEASE AND TO PROTECT
6	GAMELANDS FROM UNCONTROLLED USE.
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
8	SECTION 1. Chapter 23 of Chapter 113 is amended by adding a new
9	section to read:
10	"§ 113-301.2. Proclamation authority to protect wildlife resources and gamelands.
11	(a) The Wildlife Resources Commission may impose rules by proclamation on
12	the taking, possession, transportation, importation, exportation, purchase, and sale of
13	wildlife resources and to prescribe conditions of public use of Commission gamelands
14	consistent with existing statutory authority when it determines that immediate action is
15	necessary to protect some facet of the wildlife resources of North Carolina from serious
16	harm due to serious and unforeseen overexploitation, disease, or other malady, or when
17	serious and unforeseen situations arise that would result in uncontrolled or inappropriate
18	use of Commission gamelands.
19	(b) The authority to issue proclamations may be delegated by action of the
20	Wildlife Resources Commission to the Executive Director. Each proclamation shall
21	state the time and date upon which it becomes effective and shall be issued at least 48
22	hours before the effective date and time. A permanent file of the text and supporting
23	information for each proclamation shall be maintained in the office of the Executive
24	Director, including the justification for issuance of the proclamation.
25	(c) <u>The Executive Director shall make diligent effort to give notice of the terms</u>
26	of any proclamation to persons who may be affected by it. This effort shall include press
27	releases to communications media most likely to be read, seen, or heard in the affected
28	area, posting of notices in places likely to be frequented by affected persons, personal
29	communications by agents of the Commission, and other methods designed to reach

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1	affected parties. Proclamations shall remain in force until rescinded following the same
2	procedure established for enactment or until replaced by permanent rule making, but
3	under no condition shall a proclamation remain in effect for a period of time greater
4	<u>than 180 days.</u>
5	(d) <u>Certified copies of proclamations are entitled to judicial notice in any civil or</u>
6	criminal proceeding. The penalty for conviction of a violation of a proclamation issued

7	under this authority is a Class 3 misdemeanor."
