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Registration as a registered polysomnographic technologist is not effective until the registered 1 2 polysomnographic technologist has presented to the Secretary a copy of the registered 3 polysomnographic technologist's Board-credentialing document or has arranged for the Board 4 to electronically notify the Secretary of the registered polysomnographic technologist's 5 credentials and the Secretary has received notice from the Board. The Secretary shall develop a form for applicants seeking to file as registered polysomnographic technologists and may 6 7 require that filing be made by electronic filing and electronic fee payment. A filing with the 8 Secretary is void if a check or other payment of a required fee is returned to the Secretary by 9 the issuing institution for insufficient funds or other similar reason. 10 The Secretary shall maintain a listing of all current registered polysomnographic (b) 11 technologists. All fees paid to the Secretary shall be used to pay the costs incurred in 12 administering and enforcing this Article. The Board shall promptly notify the Secretary, by 13 mail or electronic means, when a person's credential is revoked or no longer in effect. If the 14 Secretary is notified that a registrant's credential is revoked or no longer in effect, the Secretary 15 shall promptly amend the listing in accordance with the Board's notice. A listing automatically expires on the 30th day of September of each year. A listing 16 (c) 17 shall be renewed annually upon the filing of a new listing form, credential verification, and 18 filing fee." 19 **SECTION 2.** No later than six months from the effective date of this act, the North 20 Carolina Medical Board shall identify the standards of physician supervision of persons 21 registered to practice as registered polysomnographic technologists under Article 39A of 22 Chapter 90 of the General Statutes, as enacted in Section 1 of this act. The North Carolina 23 Medical Board shall communicate the standards of supervision to all physicians licensed to 24 practice medicine under Article 1 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes. 25 **SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
