2	AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE INVOLVEMENT OF A PARENT OR GUARDIAN BEFORE
3	SCHOOL OFFICIALS MAY ADMINISTER CORPORAL PUNISHMENT ON A
4	STUDENT.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-391(a)(5) reads as rewritten:
7	"(5) Corporal punishment shall not be administered on a student who is a child
8	with a disability as defined in G.S. 115C-106.3(1) or on a student with a
9	disability who is covered under section 504 of the federal Rehabilitation Act
10	of 1973, as amended, 29 U.S.C. § 794, whose parent or guardian has stated
11	in writing that corporal punishment shall not be administered on that student.
12	Parents and guardians shall be given a form to make such an election at the
13	beginning of the school year or when the student first enters the school
14	during the year. If a parent or guardian has not submitted in writing that
15	corporal punishment shall not be used on the student, then the form shall be
16	presented to the parent or guardian at the first individualized education
17	program or section 504 plan meeting held during the school year. Corporal
18	punishment may be administered only on a student whose parent or guardian
19	has stated in writing that corporal punishment may be administered on that
20	student. Parents and guardians shall be given a form to make such an
21	election at the beginning of the school year or when the student first enters
22	the school during the school year."
23	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with
24	the 2011-2012 school year
