A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO MAKE A NOTATION ON A NORTH CAROLINA DRIVERS LICENSE SHOWING A LICENSE HOLDER'S MILITARY SERVICE.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 20-7(q) reads as rewritten:

7 Active Duty Military Designation. - The Division shall develop a military "(q) designation for drivers licenses that may, upon request, be granted to North Carolina residents 8 9 on active duty and to their spouses and dependent children. A drivers license with a military designation on it may be renewed by mail no more than two times during the license holder's 10 lifetime. A license renewed by mail under this subsection is a permanent license and does not 11 expire when the license holder returns to the State. A drivers license with a military designation 12 on it issued to a person on active duty may be renewed up to one year prior to its expiration 13 upon presentation of military or Department of Defense credentials." 14

15 SECTION 2. Chapter 20 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
16 subsection to read:

17 "(q1) Veteran Military Designation. – The Division shall develop a military designation 18 for drivers licenses that may, upon request, be granted to North Carolina residents who are 19 honorably discharged from military service in the United States Armed Forces. The designation 20 shall show the branch of military service in which the applicant served. An applicant requesting 21 this designation must produce a Form DD-214 showing the applicant has been honorably 22 discharged from the United States Armed Forces. The fee for this designation is one dollar 23 (\$1.00) for each year of the period for which the designation is issued."

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective when the Division of Motor Vehicles has completed the implementation of the Division's Next Generation Secure Driver License System or July 1, 2012, whichever occurs first, and applies to drivers licenses issued on or after that date.
