2	AN ACT TO REQUIRE THAT COUNTIES, MUNICIPALITIES, AND PUBLIC
3	CONTRACTORS USE THE FEDERAL E-VERIFY PROGRAM TO VERIFY THE
4	WORK AUTHORIZATION OF NEWLY HIRED EMPLOYEES.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1. Article 5 of Chapter 153A of the General Statutes is amended by
7	adding a new section to read:
8	"§ 153A-99.1. County verification of employee work authorization.
9	(a) Counties Must Use E-Verify Each county shall register and participate in
10	E-Verify to verify the work authorization of new employees.
11	(b) <u>E-Verify Defined. – As used in this section, the term 'E-Verify' means the federal</u>
12	E-Verify program operated by the United States Department of Homeland Security and other
13	federal agencies, or any successor or equivalent program used to verify the work authorization
14	of newly hired employees pursuant to federal law.
15	(c) <u>Nondiscrimination. – This section shall be enforced without regard to race, religion,</u>
16	gender, ethnicity, or national origin."
17	SECTION 2. Article 7 of Chapter 160A of the General Statutes is amended by
18	adding a new section to read:
19	" <u>§ 160A-169.1. City verification of employee work authorization.</u>
20	(a) <u>Cities Must Use E-Verify. – Each city shall register and participate in E-Verify to</u>
21	verify the work authorization of new employees.
22	(b) E-Verify Defined. – As used in this section, the term 'E-Verify' means the federal
23	E-Verify program operated by the United States Department of Homeland Security and other
24	federal agencies, or any successor or equivalent program used to verify the work authorization
25	of newly hired employees pursuant to federal law.
26	(c) <u>Nondiscrimination. – This section shall be enforced without regard to race, religion,</u>
27	gender, ethnicity, or national origin."
28	SECTION 3. G.S. 153A-449 reads as rewritten:
29	"§ 153A-449. Contracts with private entities.entities; contractors must use federal work
30	authorization verification program.
31	(a) <u>Authority. – A county may contract with and appropriate money to any person</u> ,
32	association, or corporation, in order to carry out any public purpose that the county is
33	authorized by law to engage in.
34	(b) <u>Contractors Must Use E-Verify. – No county may enter into a contract for the</u>

35 physical performance of services within this State unless the contractor registers and



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1	participates in E-Verify to verify the work authorization of new employees. As used in this
2	subsection, the term 'E-Verify' means the federal E-Verify program operated by the United
3	States Department of Homeland Security and other federal agencies, or any successor or
4	equivalent program used to verify the work authorization of newly hired employees pursuant to
5	federal law."
6	SECTION 4. G.S. 160A-20.1 reads as rewritten:
7	"§ 160A-20.1. Contracts with private entities.entities; contractors must use federal work
8	authorization verification program.
9	(a) <u>Authority.</u> – A city may contract with and appropriate money to any person,
10	association, or corporation, in order to carry out any public purpose that the city is authorized
11	by law to engage in.
12	(b) <u>Contractors Must Use E-Verify. – No city may enter into a contract for the physical</u>
13	performance of services within this State unless the contractor registers and participates in
14	E-Verify to verify the work authorization of new employees. As used in this subsection, the
15	term 'E-Verify' means the federal E-Verify program operated by the United States Department
16	of Homeland Security and other federal agencies, or any successor or equivalent program used
17	to verify the work authorization of newly hired employees pursuant to federal law."
18	SECTION 5. G.S. 143-129 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
19	"(j) No contract subject to this section may be awarded by any board or governing body
20	of the State, institution of State government, or any political subdivision of the State, unless the
21	contractor registers and participates in E-Verify to verify the work authorization of new
22	employees. As used in this subsection, the term 'E-Verify' means the federal E-Verify program
23	operated by the United States Department of Homeland Security and other federal agencies, or
24	any successor or equivalent program used to verify the work authorization of newly hired
25	employees pursuant to federal law."
26	SECTION 6. Article 3 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes is amended by
27	adding a new section to read:
28 29	" <u>§ 143-48.5. Contractors must use federal work authorization verification program.</u>
	An entity required to report to the Department of Administration pursuant to G.S. 143-48(b)
30 21	shall not enter into any contract for goods or services unless the contractor registers and participates in E-Verify to verify the work authorization of new employees. As used in this
31 32	section, the term 'E-Verify' means the federal E-Verify program operated by the United States
32 33	Department of Homeland Security and other federal agencies, or any successor or equivalent
33 34	program used to verify the work authorization of newly hired employees pursuant to federal
34 35	law."
36	SECTION 7. G.S. 126-7.1(f) reads as rewritten:
30 37	"(f) Each State agency, department, institution, university, community college, and local
38	education agency shall verify, in accordance with the Basic Pilot Program administered by the
39	United States Department of Homeland Security pursuant to 8 U.S.C. § 1101, et seq, each
40	individual's legal status or authorization to work in the United States after hiring the individual
41	as an employee to work in the United States. register and participate in E-Verify to verify the
42	work authorization of new employees. As used in this subsection, the term 'E-Verify' means the
43	federal E-Verify program operated by the United States Department of Homeland Security and
44	other federal agencies, or any successor or equivalent program used to verify the work
45	authorization of newly hired employees pursuant to federal law."
46	SECTION 8. This act becomes effective October 1, 2011, and applies to contracts
47	entered into or renewed on or after that date.
