6 SECTION 1. G.S. 115D-39 is amended by adding a new subsection to read	:
7 "(d) In addition, any dependent relative of a member of the armed services not qu	<u>alifying</u>
8 as a resident for tuition purposes under G.S. 116-143.1 is eligible for the State	resident
9 <u>community college tuition rate under the following conditions:</u>	
10 (1) The member of the armed services was stationed in North Carolina	a within
11 <u>the preceding 10 years.</u>	
12 (2) The member of the armed services is currently or has received o	rders or
13 <u>other official documentation deploying that member overseas within</u>	the next
14 <u>six months for a deployment to exceed one year.</u>	
15 (3) The dependent relative resides in North Carolina as a result of the m	ember's
16 <u>deployment.</u>	
17 (4) The dependent relative is sponsored by a North Carolina reside	ent who
18 provides a signed affidavit to the community college verifying that the	e North
19 <u>Carolina resident accepts financial responsibility for the student's tui</u>	tion and
20 <u>any other required educational fees.</u>	
21 <u>A dependent relative is eligible for the State resident community college tuition ra</u>	
22 this subsection for no more than 12 months. A North Carolina resident may sponsor	
23 than two nonresident students annually under this subsection. For purposes of this sub	section,
24 the term "armed services" shall mean the United States Air Force, Army, Coast Guard,	Marine
25 Corps, and Navy, the North Carolina National Guard; and any Reserve Componen	t of the
26 <u>foregoing.</u> "	
27 SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2011, and applies beginn	ng with
28 the 2011-2012 school year.
