2	employed by an employer, who qualify under this section shall receive, beginning in the month		
3	in which the career firefighter or career rescue squad worker retires on a basic service		
4	retirement, under the provisions of G.S. 128-27(a), (a1), (a2), or (c), or beginning July 1, 2011,		
5	in the case of former career firefighters and career rescue squad workers permanently disabled		
6	in the line of duty, an annual separation allowance equal to five hundred seventy-five		
7	thousandths percent (0.575%) of the annual equivalent of the base rate of compensation most		
8	recently applicable to him or her for each year of creditable service. The allowance shall be		
9	paid in equal installments on the payroll frequency used by the employer. In order to qualify for		
10	the allowance, the officer shall meet all of the following requirements:		
11	(1) Have (i) completed 30 or more years of creditable service or (ii) have		
12	attained 55 years of age and completed five or more years of creditable		
13 14	(2) Not have become eligible for uproduced Social Security benefits		
14 15	 (2) <u>Not have become eligible for unreduced Social Security benefits.</u> (3) Have completed at least five years of continuous service as a career 		
16	firefighter or career rescue squad worker as herein defined immediately		
17	preceding a service retirement. Any break in the continuous service required		
18	by this subsection because of disability retirement benefits shall not		
19	adversely affect the qualification of a career firefighter or career rescue		
20	squad worker to receive the allowance, provided the career firefighter or		
21	career rescue squad worker returns to service within 45 days after the		
22	disability benefits cease and is otherwise qualified to receive the allowance.		
23	However, a career firefighter or career rescue squad worker who is		
24	permanently disabled in the line of duty shall be eligible to receive the		
25	allowance beginning in the month after the career firefighter or career rescue		
26	squad worker would have completed 30 years of service but for the		
27	disability.		
28	(b) As used in this section, "creditable service" means the service for which credit is		
29	allowed under the retirement system of which the career firefighter or career rescue squad		
30	worker is a member, provided that at least fifty percent (50%) of the service is as a career		
31 32	<u>firefighter or career rescue squad worker as herein defined.</u> (c) Payment to a retired career firefighter or career rescue squad worker under the		
32 33	(c) <u>Payment to a retired career firefighter or career rescue squad worker under the</u> provisions of this section shall cease at:		
34	(1) The last day of the month following the death of the career firefighter or		
35	career rescue squad worker;		
36	(2) The last day of the month in which the career firefighter or career rescue		
37	squad worker becomes eligible for unreduced Social Security benefits; or		
38	(3) The first day of reemployment by any employer in any capacity, whether		
39	full-time, part-time, temporary, or contractual.		
40	(d) This section does not affect the benefits to which an individual may be entitled from		
41	State, federal, or private retirement systems. The benefits payable under this section shall not		
42	be subject to any increases in salary or retirement allowances that may be granted to local		
43	employees by any employer.		
44	(e) The governing body for each unit of local government shall be responsible for		
45	making determinations of eligibility for its employees for the benefits provided under this		
46	section and for making payments to those eligible employees."		
47	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2011.
