7	Wars; and		
8	Whereas, Home Demonstration became Home Economics in 1967 and then Family		
9	and Consumer Sciences in 1995; and		
10		hereas, from its modest beginnings, North Carolina Family and Consumer	
11 12	Sciences has grown into a diverse, wide-ranging statewide organization supported by adult		
12	volunteers and led by the professional extension staff from North Carolina's two land grant		
13 14	universities, North Carolina Agricultural & Technical University in Greensboro and North Carolina State University in Raleigh; and
