5	CAROLINA CEMETERY COMMISSION FROM THE NORTH CAROLINA
6	DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, TO ENDOW THE CEMETERY COMMISSION
7	WITH POWERS SIMILAR TO OCCUPATIONAL LICENSING BOARDS, TO MODIFY
8	THE TERM OF THE VETERINARY TECHNICIAN APPOINTEE TO THE
9	VETERINARY MEDICAL BOARD, AND TO INCREASE THE LENGTH OF THE
10	TERM OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY'S APPOINTEES TO THE GEOGRAPHIC
11	INFORMATION COORDINATING COUNCIL.
12	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

14	PART I. ELIMINATE NORTH CAROLINA STATE ART SOCIETY, INC.
15	SECTION 1.(a) Effective October 1, 2012, G.S. 105-275(41) is repealed.

23	System coverage shall be conditioned on such association's or organization's paying all of the

26	be fixed by law and by the regulations of the Board of Trustees of the Retirement System, all of
27	such funds to be paid to the Retirement System and placed in the appropriate funds. Retroactive

29 30	extent that such board requests; provided, the association or organization shall pay all of the
30 31	employer's contributions or matching funds necessary for such purposes; and, provided further, such association or organization shall collect from its employees all employees' contributions
32	necessary for such purpose, computed at such rates and in such amount as the Board of
32 33	Trustees of the Retirement System shall determine, all of such funds to be paid to the
33 34	Retirement System, together with such interest as may be due, and placed in the appropriate
