2	AN ACT TO ALLOW LOCAL SCHOOL ADMINISTRATIVE UNITS TO MAKE UP	
3	SNOW DAYS BY REQUIRING STUDENTS TO COMPLETE LESSONS POSTED	
4	ONLINE.	
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
6	SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-84.2(a)(1) reads as rewritten:	
7	"(a) School Calendar Each local board of education shall adopt a school calendar	
8	consisting of 215 days all of which shall fall within the fiscal year. A school calendar shall	
9	<i>include the following:</i>	
10	(1) (See notes) A minimum of 180 days and 1,000 hours of instruction covering	
11	at least nine calendar months. The local board shall designate when the 180	
12	instructional days shall occur. The number of instructional hours in an	
13	instructional day may vary according to local board policy and does not have	
14	to be uniform among the schools in the administrative unit. Local boards	
15	may approve school improvement plans that include days with varying	
16	amounts of instructional time. If school is closed early due to inclement	
17	weather, the day and the scheduled amount of instructional hours may count	
18	towards the required minimum to the extent allowed by State Board policy.	
19	The school calendar shall include a plan for making up days and	
20	instructional hours missed when schools are not opened due to inclement	
21	weather. Days and instructional hours may be made up through distance	
22	learning in accordance with subsection (a1) of this section."	
23	SECTION 2. G.S. 115C-84.2 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:	
24	"(a1) Use of Distance Learning to Make Up Instructional Days Lost Due to Inclement	
25	Weather A local board may permit students to make up a maximum of five days missed due	
26	to inclement weather in accordance with a plan approved by the State Board of Education. The	
27	plan shall provide for students to access and complete instruction prepared by their teachers and	
28	posted on the unit's Web portal or Web site. Students shall be required to complete the	
29	instruction within two weeks of a missed day. The unit may provide students access to	
30	computers before or after the regularly scheduled school day to complete the instruction."	
31	SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with	
32	the 2011-2012 school year.	



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
