

1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO CLARIFY THAT MUNICIPALITIES ENACTING POLITICAL SIGN
3	ORDINANCES MAY APPLY THOSE ORDINANCES TO COMPONENTS OF THE
4	STATE HIGHWAY SYSTEM WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE
5	MUNICIPALITY.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 136-32 reads as rewritten:
8	"§ 136-32. Regulation of signs.
9	
10	(f) Application Within Municipalities. – Pursuant to Article 8 of Chapter 160A of the
11	General Statutes, a city may by ordinance prohibit or regulate the placement of political signs
12	on rights-of-way of streets located within the corporate limits of a municipality and maintained
13	by the municipality. municipality, or on a highway that is within the corporate limits of a
14	municipality, but is part of the State highway system. In the absence of an ordinance
15	prohibiting or regulating the placement of political signs on the rights-of-way of streets located
16	within a municipality and maintained by the municipality, the provisions of subsections (b)
17	through (e) of this section shall apply."
18	<b>SECTION 2.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.



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
