5	SECTION 1. G.S. 108A-70.5(b)(2) reads as rewritten:							
6	"(2) Estate. – All the real and personal property considered assets of the estate							
7	available for the discharge of debt pursuant to G.S. 28A-15-1. For the							
8	purpose of recovery under this statute and for individuals who have received							
9	benefits under a qualified long-term care partnership policy as described in							
10 11	G.S. 108A-70.4, "estate" also includes any other real and personal property							
11	and other assets in which the individual had any legal title or interest at the time of death (to the extent of such interest), including assets conveyed to a							
12	time of death (to the extent of such interest), including assets conveyed to a survivor, heir, or assign of the deceased individual through joint tenancy,							
13		tenancy in common, survivorship, life estate, living trust, or other

22	release from the Division of Medical Assistance. The release from the Division shall include

33	deceased trust beneficiary received any medical assistance from the State's Medicaid program.
