7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
8	SECTION 1. G.S. 128-1.1 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:			
9	"§ 128-1.1. Dual-office holding allowed.			
10	(a) Any person who holds an appointive office, place of trust or profit in State or local			
11	government is hereby authorized by the General Assembly, pursuant to Article VI, Sec. 9 of the			
12	North Carolina Constitution, to hold concurrently one other appointive office, place of trust or			
13	profit, or an elective office in either State or local government.			
14	(a1) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, a State or local law enforcement			
15	agency may authorize any person who holds an appointive office in a State or local law			
16	enforcement agency to hold concurrently no more than two additional appointive offices with			
17	another agency.			
18	(b) Any person who holds an elective office in State or local government is hereby			
19	authorized by the General Assembly, pursuant to Article VI, Sec. 9 of the North Carolina			
20	Constitution to hold concurrently one other appointive office, place of trust or profit, in either			
21	State or local	government.
