BILL SUMMARY: This bill states that municipalities have met the requirement of notice to chronic violators of overgrown vegetation if a letter is mailed through regular postage in addition to being mailed by certified or registered mail, and the regular mail is not returned by the post office within 10 days of mailing the notification.
