1	A SENATE RESOLUTION HONORING THE CITIZENS OF THE TOWN OF BATH AND
2	THE PAMLICO SOUND REGION FOR THE CONTRIBUTIONS THEY HAVE MADE
3	TO THE STATE.
4	Whereas, Bath was incorporated by the General Assembly on March 8, 1705,
5	becoming the State's first town; and
6	Whereas, Bath served as the county seat from 1696 to 1785 and the site of Beauford
7	County's first courthouse, which was built in 1723; and
8	Whereas, in 1715, North Carolina Governor Charles Eden petitioned the Lords
9	Proprietors to establish Port Bath and, after receiving approval, proclaimed Port Bath the first
10	official port of entry on August 1, 1716, making it possible for ships and vessels to import and
11	export goods to and from the colony. Port Bath was operational between 1716 and the 1790s
12	and Will Dedicid to find the hit of the first of the firs
13	Whereas, Bath is the site of the State's oldest exiting church, St. Thomas Church,
14	which was established in Bath in 1734, and is the location of the State's first public library, which
15	was established in 1701 with 1,000 books sent from England to St. Thomas Parrish; and
16 17	Whereas, Bath hosted the General Assembly in 1744 and 1752 and was once considered a location for the capital of the colony; and
17	Whereas, 300 years ago, Edward Teach, the infamous pirate known as Blackbeard
10	along with his crew, spent several months in Bath. In 1996, the wreckage of Blackbeard's flagship
20	the "Queen Anne's Revenge" was discovered near the Beaufort Inlet; and
21	Whereas, Bath's lasting legacy provides visitors with vast opportunities to learn about
22	the State's cultural, religious, historical, and maritime heritage of the Pamlico Sound region
23	Now, therefore,
24	Be it resolved by the Senate:
25	SECTION 1. The Senate honors the citizens of the Town of Bath and the Pamlico
26	Sound region for the significant contributions they have made to the State of North Carolina.
27	SECTION 2. The Principal Clerk shall transmit a copy of this resolution to the
28	Mayor of the Town of Bath and the Manager of Hyde County on behalf of the Village of
29	Ocracoke.
30	SECTION 3. This resolution is effective upon adoption.
