12	SECTION 2. Funds. – Of the funds appropriated from the Highway Fund to the			
13	Department of Transportation for the 2024-2025 fiscal year, the sum of one hundred thousand			
14	dollars (\$100,000) in nonrecurring funds may be used by the committee to implement the			
15	purposes of this act, including for administrative costs, stipends, travel costs, and for staff and			
16	consultants hired by the committee.			
17	SECTION 3. Report. – The committee shall report its findings and recommendations			
18	to the 2025 Regular Session of the General Assembly, no later than May 1, 2025. The committee			
19	shall terminate upon the filing of this report.
